Supervised visitation and safe exchange services are highly specialized services designed to interrupt ongoing violence in families post-separation.

Unfortunately, these programs face limited support, little staff training or professional consultation, and little access to high-quality resources or experts in the field to help sustain the delicate and serious nature of their work.

Since 2008, Inspire Action has provided a dynamic and robust array of learning and growth opportunities for supervised visitation and safe exchange programs across the country.

Through our relational and responsive assistance and training, these programs are able to enhance safety and support healing for survivors of intimate partner violence, creating a strong community response to reducing violence.
